## WE'VE MOVED! STAFF BACK AT TOWN HALL

ess than 12 months after taking up temporary residence at the former Bullis Elementary campus, Town staff has moved back to 26379 Fremont Road. Thanks to our construction management firm, Toeniskoetter and Breeding (TBI), the final phase of this project has been surprisingly quick and efficient. This beautiful 8500 sq. ft. municipal center is now fully operational and ready for business. The Peter Duxbury designed building has been widely recognized for its Ecofriendly design and the beautiful way it integrates into the Town's rural character and environment.... and everyone agrees that it allows the Town staff to serve the needs of the community in a much more efficient manner.



The move-in started on May 3rd when the Los Altos Hills Town council hosted a joint meeting with the Los Altos City council. Later that week, on May 5th, the first regular Town

Council meeting was held in the new facility. The staff soon followed the council, completing the operations move over the weekend of May 21st. While the relocation was going on, the last details of the project, including final commissioning and landscaping were wrapped up. A celebration to dedicate this incredible facility is scheduled for 7:00 PM, June 16th. All residents are welcome at the party!

While you're at the dedication, check the building's innovative design, which allows three different Town committees to meet simultaneously. The council chamber is a particularly pleasing space, with many thoughtful features to facilitate the Town's numerous public meetings. You can also marvel at your friends' and neighbors' creative tile designs on the donor wall, or get a technical tour of the on-site solar power system, which powers the building. The location is the same, but oh what a difference a year makes!

### **CITY MANAGER'S REPORT**

#### Farewell to Bullis Offices and Welcome Home to New Town Hall

Since June 8, 2004, Town staff has been serving the community

at Bullis-Purissima Elementary School. The site, just down the road from Old Town Hall, has proven to be a great "temporary" fit for our operational and meeting needs. During our stay at Bullis, we have introduced longer customer service hours, which have received rave reviews. With the completion of the New Town Hall, we have scheduled our move back beginning on Friday, May 20

with the goal of reopening for business on Wednesday, May 25. Town phones and fax will be operational in the interim and staff will be checking it at the end of each move day. While professional movers will do most of the heavy lifting, staff will be sorting, boxing and identifying reusable furnishings, setting up offices and learning the new buildings' systems during the closure and over the intervening weekend.

Staff is very excited about moving back to the New Town Hall and looking forward to delivering services in this wonderful, community facility!

#### Report on April 2 Town-Wide Clean-Up Day

Due to the muddy conditions at Westwind Barn caused by inclement weather prior to the April 2 Town-wide Clean-Up, the Town and LAGCo were forced to close down this collection venue with no public notice. Thanks to Steve Garcia, the Town's Public Safety Officer, the venue was manned throughout that Saturday to redirect residents to the other collection locations in Town. 34 residents were redirected and advised of the two free "curbside" clean-up dates they can schedule with LAGCo at their convenience.

#### Town Parks and Recreation Supervisor Completes Boston Marathon

Jimmy Forbis, the Town's Parks and Recreation Supervisor, in fulfillment of a major life goal, competed in and completed the grueling 26.2 mile Boston Marathon on April 18, 2005. A culmination of 16 years of preparation and training, Jimmy qualified for the race at the California International Marathon in December with a time of 3 hours 9 minutes and 20 seconds. While Kenyan men have dominated this event for the last 15 years, American men have been breaking into the top finisher ranks. Kudos to our colleague Jimmy on this extraordinary achievement!

The opportunity to add tiles to the wall will continue until the 150-foot wall is completely filled. Plan to attend the Dedication Event on June 16th at 7 PM.



### BULLIS CHARTER SCHOOL NEWS

#### A Wonderful First Year

Summer is in the air! Students have proudly finished their first year at the charter school and are looking forward to returning next fall. BCS has brought learning to life by taking students to Washington DC, presenting four full-scale plays, plus music recitals and dance recitals. Students have performed servicelearning projects including raising over \$700 for Tsunami relief via weekly student bake sales, cleaning a beach in Santa Cruz, and participating in recycling and school beautifica-



tion programs. Students have held a science fair, performed in assemblies, created gardens, participated in running clubs, student council, Odyssey of the Mind, yoga, homework club, sports club, circuit training, dance club, volleyball, French, Spanish, German languages, student newspaper, student store, art, and vocal and instrumental music.

#### **Growing Enrollment**

This Fall, BCS will grow from 170 to 230 students, with a wait list of over 100 children. Los Altos School District (LASD) residents received priority due to the charter school's location within the district. 96% of the students admitted for Fall 2005 will come from LASD. In order to remain small yet have critical mass financially and for school activities, BCS plans to grow to 310 students over time.

Families selected BCS primarily for its individualized learning programs, enriched and challenging curriculum, small class sizes, emphasis on service-learning, character, and leadership, its award winning principal and highly qualified staff.

## Developing Best Educational Practices: BCS Awarded \$360,000 Grant for Individualized Learning, Other Programs from CA Department of Education

We believe this award is an objective endorsement of what we have been doing and supports where we are heading. In State Superintendent of Public Instruction, Jack O'Connell's press release, he noted, "Charter schools serve as laboratories to develop best educational practices. With these grants, we hope to replicate and share best practices with other schools in the state to focus on increasing student achievement."

These restricted funds are targeted to support teacher and curricular development in the area of individualized learning, one of the main tenets of the school mission, with emphasis on the "Schools Attuned" program.

## LAH COUNTY FIRE DISTRICT

### FREE BRUSH CHIPPING PROGRAM

he Los Altos Hills County Fire Distinct is offering residents a free service of chipping and disposal of brush and prunings.

Each area of the Town will be systematically notified of the service by a letter containing a postcard to return informing the contractor of your request to have the service.

Here is how it works: During the spring and early summer the District's contractor will be in your neighborhood available to chip brush and tree prunings that you have cut and stacked on your property. Chips will be left with you or the contractor will take them. If you want the free service, you will need to plan to do your pruning and make an appointment with the contractor.



Since 1997, this program was offered only to homes West of Highway 280 in high fire hazard areas and was regarded as very successful.

This year it has been extended to cover all of Los Altos Hills. The Fire District encourages you to take advantage of this free assistance to make your home more defensible against a wildland fire.

- All flammable vegetation should be cleared a minimum of 30 feet around structures.
  - Tree limbs should be cut within 10 feet of chimneys.
- Trees that are 18 feet or taller should be limbed 6 feet above the ground.

The Fire District contractor is S. P. McClenahan Co. They will perform the service during the spring and early summer. Remember: The postcard must be returned to the S.P. McClenahan Co. for this service to be sched**uled**. The contractor will call to schedule an appointment with you for the brush chipping service.

The LAH County Fire District services are provided by the Santa Clara County Fire Department.

#### Iraq Is Not So Far Away

hile the war in Iraq seems far removed from Los Altos Hills, one young man from Los Altos Hills is heroically serving our nation. Local resident, Specialist Bobby Magami, currently serves in the Army National Guard in Baghdad at Camp Prosperity. He is stationed at one of the checkpoints to Baghdad - carrying out his duty to ensure the safety of the city.

Bobby, who resides on Olive Tree Lane in Los Altos Hills, is 25 years old and the son of Maryam Kellar.

Bobby graduated from Gunn High School in Palo Alto, where he was passionate about an Army career - since he was 4 yrs old he wanted to be in the Army. As soon as he graduated, he joined the Army and spent 2 years in Fort Benning, Georgia and Fort Riley, Kansas, and served in Kuwait. His rank is Specialist in United States Army.

Friends describe him as very ethical and honest. During his high school years he helped feed disabled students during his lunch hours!

He is single and has a wonderful girlfriend, Crystle Borrego who is employed in Los Altos.

His mother Maryam states, "Not a day goes by that I do not worry about his safety. If there are others in the community who have loved ones serving, we should join in support of all of them. They appreciate receiving messages of encouragement from home."
